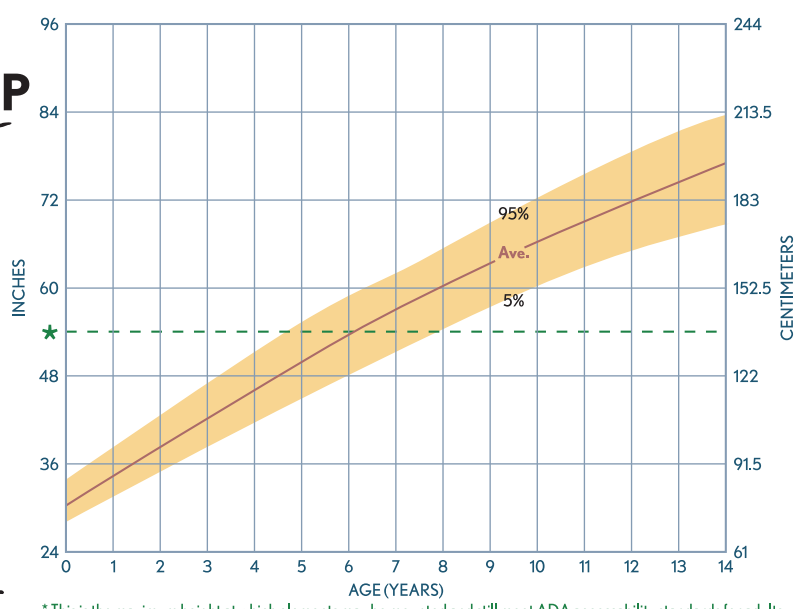
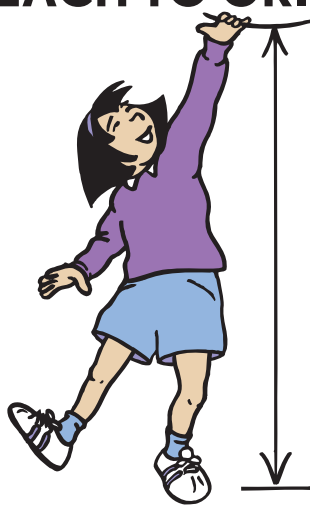
## HEAD WIDTH

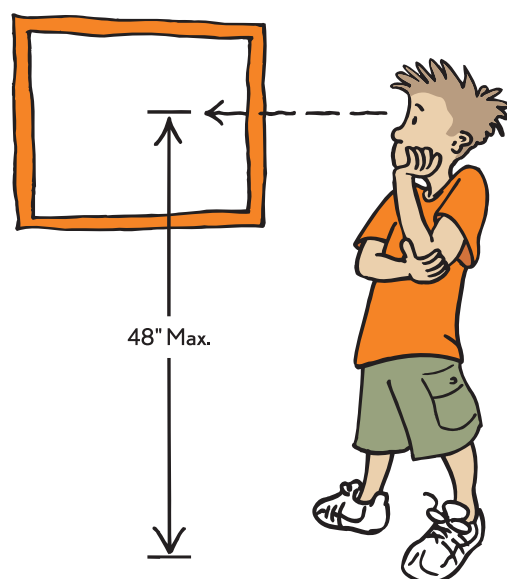

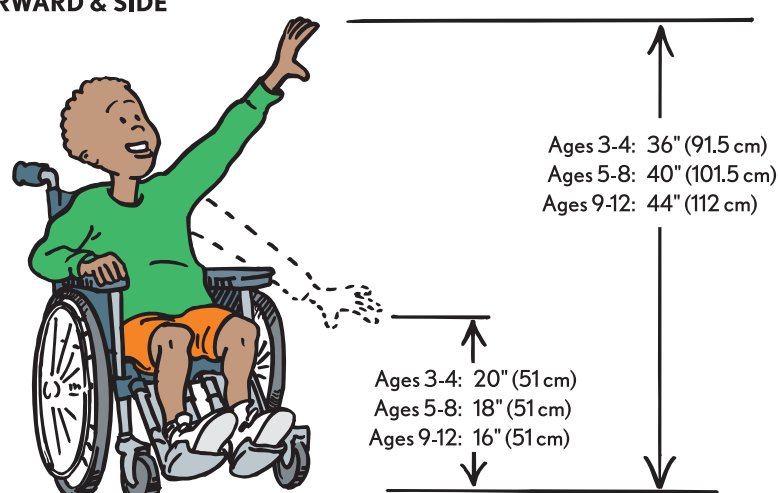
